Research arm of The Children's Hospital at Westmead with history dating back to the 1880's.

Significant contributor to the largest health and medical research precinct in NSW.

280+ research staff – mix of scientists and clinicians quickly translating research into practice.

3 types of research

<u>Basic Science</u> in the laboratory to understand disease processes in children;

<u>Clinical Research</u> to develop better diagnostic techniques and treatment methods;

<u>Population Health Research</u> to understand the impact of disease in the broader community.

The need for research

Muscular dystrophies affect about 1 in 1,000 children. Life expectancy is rarely beyond late teens or early adulthood.

Conditions such as Neurofibromatosis Type 1 affect around 1 in 3,000 children. Treatment can be as serious as limb amputation.

Currently there are over 700 children in Australia per year that are diagnosed with cancer. Around 100 children will lose their battle.

In Australia, one in four children is overweight or obese. Obesity in childhood is one of the main preventable causes of a raft of serious diseases, from diabetes to heart disease and cancer.

About 70% of children with chronic kidney disease develop end-stage renal failure by the time they reach 20 years of age.

Though rare, meningococcal B is deadly in five to ten per cent of cases and can be catastrophic for survivors. There is still no vaccine against meningococcal B.
