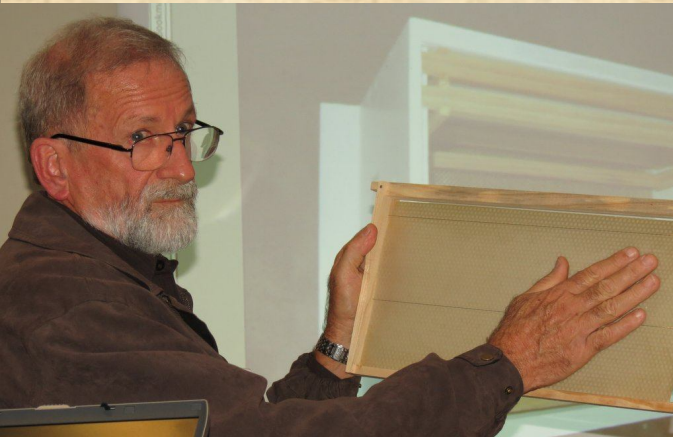
But he would feed you with the choicest foods
