Simple PowerPoint rules

We have had several PowerPoint presentations in recent time which have been difficult to read. For a room the size where we meet and our audience I suggest a minimum font size of 20 and a contrast of font colour and background. Please see examples below. Some of the slides last week were grey on grey and impossible to read

Follow the 5/5/5 rule

To keep your audience from feeling overwhelmed, you should keep the text on each slide short and to the point. Some experts suggest using the 5/5/5 rule: no more than five words per line of text, five lines of text per slide, or five text-heavy slides in a row.

Choose readable colours and fonts



Your text should be easy to read and pleasant to look at. Large, simple fonts and theme colours are always your best bet. The best fonts and colours can vary depending on your presentation setting. Presenting in a large room? Make your text larger than usual so people in the back can read it. Presenting with the lights on? Dark text on a light background is your best bet for visibility.

Almost anything can be achieved with PowerPoint but if the simple rules above are not followed and text cannot be read the presentation effect is wasted.
