



Ted Waters Manly Sunrise

Ted is President of Manly Sunrise and is an inspiration to Rotarians on how to collect funds and get things done

How to raise the profile of your club

In the six months 3 years ago Manly Sunrise had lost 6 members they raised \$25,000 the previous year.

They lost most of their fundraising activity and then formed a committee of 3 to investigate methods of creating major projects, They chose 3 projects, 1) alcohol fueled violence, 2) mental illness, 3) homelessness and violence against women.

They decided to build a shower facility and kitchen for homeless people and teamed up with the Salvation Army for a facility which cost of \$56k

They met with the Local Newspaper about publicity which they received, and a local resident donated \$25k to their funds.

They applied to Mike Baird the local MP and received \$39,000.

They decide to collect used Brassieres for ladies in the Pacific Islands. They collected 6,000 bras, They erected a Hills hoist on Manly beach and hung Bras on it and it got to page one of the Manly Daily

They started Pioneer Club House

Homelessness - they identified 2 homes in Manly at the Harbour Trust and raised \$230,000 to start the project.

More members – they were down to 26 members and they gained 11 new members in the first year, but lost 5 and they have recruited 3 new members under age 40,

Fund raising, they are only interested in Projects over \$10k They started a fun run and in the first year, it is 80% cross country, year 1 they raised \$35k year 2 they raised \$65,000 and hope for \$100K + this year.

Richard Glover Encounter




