Once again Lifeline Harbour to Hawkesbury would like to express their sincere thanks to you and your members for the assistance given at our recent book fair held at Knox Grammar School in July 2016.

The continued support your club gives to Lifeline is greatly appreciated and makes a significant impact upon the success of the book fair. Loading the hundreds of boxes of books into trucks, even with the help of conveyor equipment, is (as your members know) heavy physical work, as is the packing up of unsold boxes for transport at the end of the book fair. All in all a huge task which would not be possible without the help of volunteers such as your club's members. Could you please pass on our sincere thanks to the Rotarians who were recruited for this task?

We are delighted to report that over the four days of our 2016 book fair over \$181,000 was raised to support Lifeline's crisis support and suicide prevention services.

While Lifeline Harbour to Hawkesbury receives some Government funding to support our crisis support services, we are still required to raise significant funding every year to maintain and operate all of those vital services. The book fair held at Knox is one of the major fundraising activities that enable us to reach the target amount and ensure that none of our services cease to operate.

Lifeline's telephone and face-to-face counsellors all support people in some form of crisis, and at times, actually save lives. The 24-hour telephone Crisis Line [13 11 14] operating out of our Centre currently answers around 9,000 calls a month. Our centre supports callers and clients with issues such as relationship breakdown, depression, anxiety, drug and alcohol problems, financial stresses, loss and grief, abuse and trauma, and tendency to suicide. Your assistance with our book fair helps to ensure that these crucial services can continue.

Enclosed is a Certificate of Appreciation, and again, thank you for your ongoing support to Lifeline Harbour to Hawkesbury.
