You don't see many Indonesian restaurants this side of the harbour so when an opportunity for quality Indonesian cuisine, excellent entertainment and pleasant company appears, then perhaps it is worth considering.

The evening offers:

- Genuine Indonesian food prepared by experts.
- Traditional Indonesian musical acts.
- Entertaining raffles and auctions.
- The company of many very nice people including, hopefully, representatives from the Indonesian Consulate, Lane Cove Council and Rotary District 9685

This is an opportunity for diners to wear that souvenir batik shirt or sarong that they have never quite found a suitable function for.

If you are worried about spicy food, please don't be. The spices will generally be 'on the side' to be chosen to your taste. You will feast on;

- Potato Croquette
